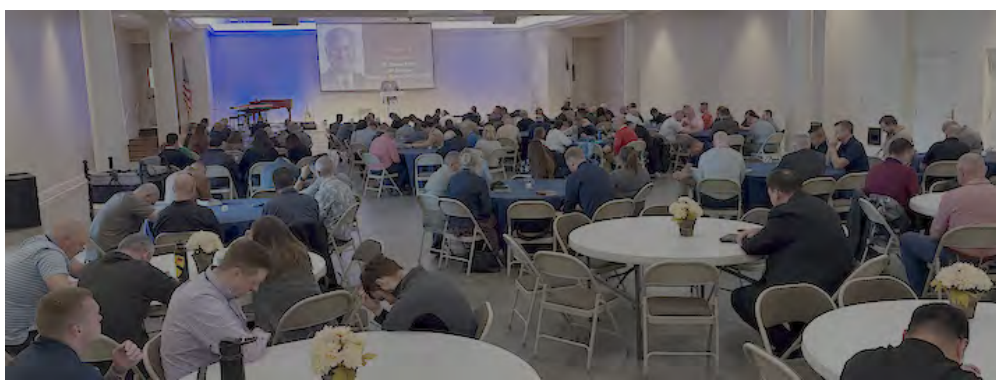
## LCN Membership: A Membership That Invests in Your Leaders

## Liberty Baptist Fellowship: Serving Where You're Called

The **Liberty Baptist Fellowship Chaplain Conference**, held April 20-23 in Lynchburg VA, and centered on the theme **“Walking the Call,”** brought together military, healthcare, community, and institutional chaplains for several days of worship, training, fellowship, and encouragement.



The conference opened with an in-depth Moral Injury Workshop led by Dr. Harold G. Koenig, equipping chaplains with current research, practical insight, and spiritually integrated approaches for understanding and addressing moral injury among those they serve. Throughout the conference, plenary sessions, breakout groups, panel discussions, testimonies, and worship emphasized what it means to faithfully walk out one's calling with integrity, resilience, and compassion in diverse ministry contexts. A featured plenary session was delivered by **Secretary Doug Collins**, U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs, who challenged chaplains to live and minister the "standard" of **salt and light**, faithfully and consistently bearing witness to Christ through character, presence, and service.



Breakout sessions tailored for military, healthcare, community chaplains, and spouses fostered meaningful peer connection and shared learning, while fellowship activities and group gatherings strengthened relational support. In keeping with the conference's commitment to caring for the whole chaplain, individual counseling sessions were offered, providing space for personal reflection, renewal, and support. The conference concluded with a powerful closing keynote address by Evangelist Tim Lee, followed by corporate worship and prayer, sending chaplains back to their ministries encouraged, equipped, and recommitted to faithfully **walking the call** God has placed on their lives.
